Parent Consultations

Remembrance

In addition to selling poppies for the last week in school, the children have been doing a range of different activities to commemorate Remembrance Day. It was very moving and the rest of school sat and listened beautifully.

The Governing Body

Last week we had our monthly finance committee meeting. We discussed a range of issues related to school finance, including the challenging nature of budgets and the difficulties that many schools are facing across the country.

Our Chair of Governors – Simone Roberts also came in last week. She popped into classrooms, met with me and checked our Single Central Record. This is the detailed record of all the checks we carry out on staff before they are allowed to work in schools. Simone monitors this in her role as the Chair and governor responsible for Safeguarding.

This week there is a Resources committee meeting ahead of the Autumn Term Full Governing Body meeting at the end of the month.

Book Fair

This week there will be the annual Book Fair after school on Tuesday to Friday. This year you will need to come into school via the Office rather than via the playground doors. This is to ensure that After School Club can continue as usual and all the children are safe. There are a range of books (and other things) sent by the Fair at a range of prices. We are not able to take credit or debit cards and it is really helpful if you have some change. The books are reasonably priced and if we sell over a certain amount we get commission to spend on books for the classrooms.

Attendance Information

Please remember that Requests for Authorised Absence are only for **exceptional circumstances.** If you would like more information about what is considered an exceptional circumstance and the penalties for unauthorised absence, please go to <u>https://www.barnet.gov.uk/citizen-home/schools-and-education/parents.html</u>.

The Educational Welfare Officer comes to visit our school every term to review our attendance information. There is a particular focus on children who's attendance is **below 90%** (this does not include children with a particular medical need).

- \circ 90% attendance = 1/2 school day missed every week.
- One school year at 90% attendance = 4 weeks of learning missed.
- Over 5 school years of school = 1/2 school year missed.

• All children nationally whose school attendance is 90% or below are considered to be 'persistent absentees'.

If you would like to know your child's attendance so far this term, you can ask your child's teacher at parent consultations.
