





Monkfrith Newsletter Autumn Term: Issue 13

Dear Parents,

Unfortunately I have no choice but to start this week's newsletter with something about parking.

Over the last three weeks I have spent an average of 1 hour each day listening to the concerns of residents and other parents about parking in and around school at the start and end of the school day. I have received emails and telephone calls as well as meetings as these people are justifiably angry and frustrated at the situation. It is also frustrating for me as I have spent about 5 hours of my week dealing with these issues, rather than working on improving school for our children.

I am including some of the specific complaints to show the scale of the problems:

- stopping on the zig zags both at the Knoll Drive entrance and the gate on Monkfrith Way
- stopping on the zebra crossing to let children out
- stopping in the middle of the road, getting out to help children out of the car and then taking them to the Reception gate, leaving the car in the middle of the road
- parking across the drives of local residents preventing them leaving their house
- driving and parking on the grass verges all the way along Knoll Drive and Brookside South which has turned them into mud flats
- trying to pull into the car park entrance and then reversing out onto Monkfrith Way
- cars parking on the corner of Knoll Drive and Cedar Rise on double yellow lines making it unsafe to cross the road
- sitting outside school at the start and end of the school day for up to 15 minutes with the engine running (which is against the Highway Code because of the dangers to health and then environment) https://www.rac.co.uk/drive/advice/emissions/idling/
- parents becoming very aggressive and shouting when challenged on any of the above by staff and other parents.

I have written to Barnet Council to ask them to look at parking measures around school and I have also requested support from the Safer Neighbourhood Team. I am also considering other measures that we can take to ensure the safety of our children.

In the meantime, please drive and park responsibly and safely.

Funding Letter
