YASS!, & pp4danBarnet Statement

YASS! & pp4danBarnet is a self help Voluntary Community Organisation run by parent-carers to support each other and share information and experiences. Our Aim is to enable our children and young people, aged 0 – 25 years, to feel confident, comfortable, and have practical experience and understanding of 'normal' situations and for 'normal people' to understand and be accepting of our members and any differences of those with a disability and additional needs.

YASS! & pp4danBarnet is for children and young people aged 0 – 25.

YASS! & pp4danBarnet's 4 main Aims on which to base our Objectives and Work:

- 1 to provide regular activities, for many reasons.
- 2 to provide information, in several ways.
- 3 to provide family support, face to face meetings, attending meetings/Tribunals, preparing letters and Reports for meetings and Tribunals. All very confidential following our Policies and Procedures, and often not known they we are involved. The families are always in full control! Families can self refer, but the main bulk of our work comes from referrals, especially after everyone else has failed to get the right support in place.
- 4 to lobby for better services achieved in several ways.

YASS! & pp4danBarnet is a truly independent organisation so all our work for All Barnet families affected by disability and additional needs with many, many other organisations is by agreement, not command.

YASS! & pp4danBarnet is about Inclusion, yes concentrating on special needs, but with a holistic, Social Model approach to try and offer to families the choice and take advantage of everything that others may take for granted.

It is because YASS! was recognised as a successful, independent Parent-Carer Support organisation, for all its work with parent-carers and others, that YASS! was asked to set up and run pp4danBarnet.

30 CEOP Nude Selfies What Every Parent Needs to know A New CEOP (Child Exploitation and Online Protection) Resource. This is a series of four short animated films for parents and carers offering advice on how to help keep their children safe from the risks associated with sharing nude and nearly nude images. The films aim to help parents and carers:

- Understand young people's motivations for sending nude selfies.
- Plan to respond positively and constructively to an incident in which their child has shared a nude selfie.
- Gain confidence and skills in initiating preventative conversations.
- Identify risky behaviours or situations and know where to seek help.

In September 2015 MacIntyre, working in partnership with Westminster Kingsway College and the LB Camden will open the doors to its first London based Further Education provision for young people with special education needs and disabilities. This project will deliver programmes of education and support for up to 50 young people. Their Further Education programme "No Limits" will be delivered to young people aged 16 to 25 years with severe and complex needs.

The No Limits Programme will focus on health, employment, independent living and community inclusion and the learning is underpinned by specialist support. Programmes will be flexible and individualised, focussing on what the students need to learn to support their transition from school to adulthood and prepare them for what they want to do next. As part of their Individual Learning Plan, students may access courses and vocational training opportunities at other Westminster Kingsway College Centres including catering, creative arts, health and beauty. Most importantly each learner will have a stimulating, meaningful and exciting time in college.

The new provision is said to enhance local opportunities for education for young people in Camden and enable them to live and learn locally, close to their families and communities and where they will live as adults. Similar to all Colleges they may offer places to out of borough applicants, especially those in Barnet who border on this facility.
