Sickness and Attendance

A reminder that if your child is not in school as a result of sickness and/or diarrhoea then the Government guidelines are that they should not be back in school until they are symptom-free for 48 hours. - If you bring your child a snack for after school, then please ensure that they do not eat anything with nuts until they have left the school site.

We have several children and members of staff who have allergies to nuts and we want to do everything we can to provide a safe environment.
