Fundraising

1. Join.

If you, like me, you shop on your phone, download the app for free.

Head to the Friends of Monkfrith School page and create an account (you can use your Facebook account if that is easier)

2. Shop.

Every time you shop online, go to easyfundraising first, pick the retailer you want and start shopping. You will get a message to say that any purchases you make will lead to a donation to FOMS.

3. Raise.

After you've checked out, that retailer will make a donation to us for no extra cost whatsoever!

There are no catches or hidden charges and we will be really grateful for your donations. I signed up this weekend and made my first purchase.
