Arrangements for September for children currently in Reception

As we have done for the three years, 'soft start' will continue in September. This means that all children from Year 1 to Year 6 can be dropped off at the gate on Monkfrith Way between 8.30am and 8.55am. A member of the Leadership Team (myself, Mrs Whent or Miss Sutton) will always be there to receive them.

The children then make their own way to their classroom where there will be a teaching assistant checking they have arrived. Depending on the year group, there will be different activities going on in the classrooms from reading to singing to English or maths activities. Every minute counts!

If your child will be moving from Reception to Year 1 please bring them to the gate on Monkfrith Way. From there they will be taken in small groups to their classrooms by Year 6 helpers until they are confident to go on their own. If they need to go to the toilet when they arrive, the Year 6 children will make sure they are 'checked in' with the adult in the classroom first. The children will be doing some practices during the school day in the next two weeks ready for the move to Year 1.

East Barnet Festival Art Competition

This year the theme of the East Barnet Arts Festival was a piece of art inspired by Oakhill Park. Year 5 visited the park earlier this term, sketchbooks and sketching pencils in hand to create their entries.
