

# Monkfrith Newsletter Autumn Term 2019: Issue 12

This is along newsletter this week. There is a guide to Christmas at Monkfrith. I have tried to include all the key dates and how things happen throughout December including booking tickets for our Christmas shows. There is a bit more information to come, but this will give you a good place to start. There is also information from FOMS about the Christmas Fair.

There are so many things to celebrate and be proud of in this week's newsletter however I have no choice but to start with parking and driving around school. I am currently receiving complaints every day about the anti social behaviour of parents from our school. These are from other parents and local residents. The way that some parents drive and park in Monkfrith Way, Knoll Drive, Cedar Rise and Brookside South is dangerous and shows a disregard for our children's safety.

Families who chose to walk to school are frightened for their children as cars reverse onto the kerb, park on the pavement, stop in the middle of the road or crossing to let children out of the car and then become aggressive when challenged about it. **We are a community.** In School we work hard to promote values of kindness and respect; please show this in the way that you park or drive.

## **Breakfast Club and After School Club changes**

From January there will be a slight change to After School Club. Following requests from parents, we will now be finishing at 6pm not 5.45pm. This means that there will be a small increase in the cost. At the moment the short stay (until 4.30pm) will continue at £5, but the cost of picking up between this time and 6pm will increase by £1 to £10 for the first child and £8 for siblings.

We would also like to remind parents that children must be collected and signed out no later than 4.30pm to be charged for a short stay. If your child has not been signed out at or before this time, you will be changed for the full amount.

After School Club is extremely popular and you will have noticed that there have been a number of days recently where we have not been able to take any more children. However some parents are leaving it very late in the day to cancel their bookings, which means that we are not able to offer that place to another child. If you book a place, but no longer require it, you must cancel **before 11am on the day** to avoid a £5 late cancellation charge.

Last Friday, all of Year 2 dressed up as inspirational people who have changed the world we live in. Instrumental Lessons for NEW students who wish to start lessons at the beginning of the SPRING Term 2020

At Monkfrith School we offer **individual lessons** on the following instruments: trumpet, trombone, piano, guitar, flute, clarinet, saxophone and recorder.

Group tuition from Year 2 on the recorder is also taught at Monkfrith. If you are interested in group tuition please sign up at the school office.

If you would like your child to **start individual lessons in January**, you have to log on to <u>www.beatrust.org.uk</u> to enrol. There is a lot of helpful information on the website, but should you need any further advice please leave a note at the school office for the instrumental teacher who will be able to answer your questions; your child may need a suitability test.
