

Monkfrith Newsletter Autumn Term 2019: Issue 9

All the classes started their new topics last week, many of which have a history focus. In **Year 1** they have been learning and writing about different types of memories as part of their topic – **Memory Box**. In **Year 2** their topic this half term is called

Dreamers and Changemakers. So far they have learnt about the life and impact of Mary Seacole. In Year 3 they will be learning about prehistoric periods in their topic, Tribal Tales. I popped into the classooms on Friday afternoon and found all the children doing their own cave paintings as you can see from the photo! In Year 4 they have started learning about the Romans and in Year 5 their topic is



focussed on the **Tudors**. **Year 6** have started their new topic, the **Frozen Kingdom**, although they have also been getting ready for their class assembly this Wednesday morning.

In KS2 the children have specialist music teaching by Ms Folan, who also runs KS2 Choir. Last half term both **Year 5** classes focussed on writing and composing their own song. Ms Folan taught them about how to develop song lyrics but left it very much up to the children to come up with the theme and the style of the song. On Thursday I was treated to my own performance from each class. In 5F they had written an upbeat song about going on a trip. It was really catchy and I have been singing some of the lyrics as I walk around school. In 5D their song was about protesting about taking action over climate change and was incredibly moving. Parents will be treated to a performance in their class assembly later in the year, however Mrs Folan and I are in discussions about how to record the song and put on the website so everyone can share in their talents!

Our assembly and PHSE theme this half term is about kindness and how to show empathy to others.

UK Elections - School Closure

As you will have seen the date for the election has been confirmed as Thursday 12th December. School will be closed that day as we are a polling station. Luckily this is one of the few days in the run up to Christmas where not much was happening. Year 2 have been able to rearrange their school trip.

Jasper in Year 4 reads...Itch by Simon Mayo...



Itch was one of my favourite books. It's all about Itch who is 14 years old. He is an element collector and is very interested in chemistry. He finds an element that looks like iron but it is actually a new element, number 126. It was changing colour and when he and his geography teacher checked for radioactive molecules they measured 10,000 clicks per second, which is really high. This dangerous new element causes a lot of kerfuffle. Itch, his cousin and his little sister have to save the planet with only a bag of elements and Itch's knowledge of science to help them.

This book would be good for key stage 2, it has some sudden action.

Thank you Jasper. I absolutely LOVE this book and was thinking about doing a review myself and then Jasper's arrived! It is the first of three books about Itch's adventures. It is a little bit gory in places as it describes some of the effects of radioactive material on the human body, but the story is compelling. I am a big fan of

Simon Mayo's writing. If you have an older child (Year 8 upwards) he has also written another great book – Blame – which is set in a dystopian version of London in which children are punished for 'heritage crimes'. His most recent book – Mad Blood Stirring – is for adults and I also enjoyed that!
