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<p>Physical Development</p>	<p>Skills developed across the year Children: Use a pencil and hold it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are correctly formed. Handle tools, objects, construction and malleable materials safely and with increasing control. Negotiate space successfully when playing racing and chasing games with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction to avoid obstacles. Travel with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment. Show increasing control over an object in pushing, patting, throwing, catching or kicking it. Use simple tools to effect changes to materials. Eat a healthy range of foodstuffs and understand the need for variety in food. Are usually dry and clean during the day. Show some understanding that good practices with regard to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health. Show understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges, and considers and manages some risks.</p>					
<p>Communication and Language/ Literacy</p>	<p>Communication skills developed across the year Children: Listen attentively in a range of situations. Listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and respond to what they hear with relevant comments, questions or actions. Give their attention to what others say and respond appropriately, while engaged in another activity. Can follow instructions involving several ideas or actions. Answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events. Develop their own narratives and explanations by connecting ideas or events. Reading skills developed across the year Children: Read and understand simple sentences. Use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately. Read some common irregular words. Demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read. Writing skills developed across the year Children: Use their phonic knowledge to write words in ways which match their spoken sounds. Write some irregular common words. Write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others.</p>
