World Book Day - 5th March

World Book Day is a registered charity on a mission to give every child and young person a book of their own. It's also a celebration of authors, illustrators, books and (most importantly) it's a celebration of reading. In fact, it's the biggest celebration of its kind, designated by <u>UNESCO</u> as a worldwide celebration of books and reading, and marked in over 100 countries all over the world.

This year at Monkfrith we have decided to host a 'book swap' day for World Book Day rather than dress up. Each child will have the opportunity to bring a book to school they own and have read (and don't mind giving away to another child), which they can promote in their class and then swap for another child's book they would like to read. If your child would like to take part in the 'book swap' then they must bring their book to swap into school on the 5th March.

In the classroom all the children (from Reception to Year 6) will be focusing on one book which raises issues about the environment and sustainability. I will share some of the outcomes next week.

First Aid



Last week (and this week) FOMS have very kindly paid for all the classes to

have first aid lessons. This is an amazing opportunity — each year group has a specially tailored session. Oak and Willow classes had their sessions on Tuesday and spent the rest of the week finding out about parts of the body and writing about what they had learnt. Year

1 carried out their lesson using some very poorly teddy bears as you can see from the photos! They also learnt how to use a phone to get help. In Year 5 they used dummies and were taught how to carry out CPR. If your child has not had their session yet, they will take part next week. A huge thank you to FOMS for supporting



this. We would not be able to offer this opportunity without them!

KS1 Show – important ticket information


