

Monkfrith School Autumn Term 2020 Newsletter 9



The week we have been looking at different values in the classroom.

Reception have built on the work they have been doing on Zones of Regulation to think about kindness using the book This is Our House.



In Year 1 this half term they are focusing on cooperating, working together and sharing. In Year 2 they have been thinking about kindness. This lovely display includes children's writing about a time when they have shown kindness to someone else. In Year 3 they have focused on respect. They have thought about how we show respect to others but also how the way we behave means that we are shown respect. In Year 4 they have been thinking about bravery and have used the text Brave Molly. In Year 5 they have been working on the idea of what it means to be part of a community. In Year 6 they have been exploring Respect, focusing particularly on how to show respect during a disagreement, and how to have self-respect when feeling the impact of peer pressure, or when being dared to do something.



Alongside the newsletter this week you will also be receiving a guide to Zones of Regulation. This approach helps children to understand and talk about their emotions but also develops their strategies to regulate how they are feeling.

School Priority for 2020/21: Speaking and Listening

One of the areas of learning that we are going to be focusing on at school is Speaking and Listening. In the classroom we are giving more opportunities for this, encouraging children to speak in full sentences when answering questions and sharing their ideas. We would also appreciate your support at home.

In Reception, Year 1 and 2 we are going to be sending home 'talking homeworks'. This is an opportunity for children to talk about what they have learnt or will be learning.

In KS2 we are going to share a specific question each week in the newsletter about the previous week's learning to start a conversation and practice what they have been learning at school.

Covid-19 Update 9th November

Please can I remind everyone to keep their distance when dropping off in the morning. Several parents have contacted me to say they are having difficulty because of the number of parents stopping to talk to each other at the gate. If you need to talk, just move a bit further along to allow other people past.

The updated guidance for schools included very few changes for primary schools. The main change relates to members of staff who now need to work from home in line with government guidance about those who are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable.

If your child develops symptoms of Covid while at school, we will call you and ask you to collect them (and any siblings) as soon as possible. We will also ask that you confirm the child has received a negative Covid test before they can return to school.

If your child becomes unwell or tests positive outside of school hours, please email the Office as soon as possible to let us know. Emails are monitored very regularly to ensure that we can act in accordance with the guidance for school.s

We are keeping doors and windows open more than usual. Please ensure that your child has a NAMED jumper and/or fleece in school. They can wear these in the classroom.

Please ensure that you are wearing a mask at pick up and drop off and keep your distance from each other.

As part of this, children should wear odd socks (and their usual uniform). We will share more about what we did in a few weeks.


