There is lots of information in this week's newsletter - apologies for the length!









Year 1 have been focusing on determination and thinking about what they would like to try hard to get better at this year. They had some really good ideas from writing and counting to 100, to being a better artist and reading lots of books.

Times Tables



The National Curriculum expects that most children will know all the multiplication and division facts by the end of Year 4. There will be a new statutory check to measure this. All children practise their times tables in maths lessons from Year 1 and this is supplemented by short weekly tests. These tests are just one in a number of ways that we work on this objective. We also value all the effort that so many parents put in to helping with remembering these all important facts.

There is a lot of debate about whether children need to 'know' their times tables and whether quick recall is really necessary. Our aim as a school is to make sure that children are **confident** and have committed their times tables to their long term memory. By doing this, they can spend less time and effort on working out the calculation and more on using their times table knowledge to solve more complex problems.

It is also important to remember that whilst some children can learn times tables very quickly, it can take other children a little bit longer. There is no pressure from teachers about 'passing the test', but a focus on **trying your best and doing a bit better each week**.

The weekly tests in **Key Stage 2** are 5 minutes and will now focus on both multiplication and division facts e.g. $6 \times 2 = 12$, $2 \times 6 = 12$, $12 \div 2 = 6$, $12 \div 6 = 2$.

At the start of the year, children will be asked to warm-up by having a go at a test they have previously passed. If they have already earnt all their badges, they will do other activities related to times tables to practice applying their knowledge.

Times tables tests will be introduced to Key Stage 1 later in the year when this part of the curriculum is covered. There will be more in the newsletter in the Spring Term about this. By the end of Year 2 children need to know the multiplication and division facts for at least the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Statutory Testing

One of the consequences of the pandemic has been that schools have not been required to undertake any statutory testing. The Government have been clear that they intend for a full programme of testing to return for this academic year.

Here is a summary of what will happen for your information, but I would like to remind everyone that children do not need to feel worried or anxious about these tests or assessments. The good quality teaching that they receive in their classrooms, the support you give with homework and regular reading at home, along with trying their best is enough for most children. In some cases, we may provide some additional support to help with a particular aspect of learning.

EYFS - This is the first proper year of the Reception Baseline Assessment. If your child started in Oak or Willow Class last week, then they will take part in a short 1:1 assessment with their class teacher to see what they can do before starting school. These results have to be submitted to Government and will be used to help judge the progress they make over time. In addition to this, as we always do, our staff will be carrying out our own assessments and observations of the children to help identify their starting points and their next steps.

Year 1 - In June of Year 1, children will be taking the Phonics Screening Check. This is a short 1:1 assessment carried out by their class teacher. It checks their ability to read words using the phonics that they have been taught in Reception and Year 1. The outcome of this, along with the class teachers' assessment of their overall reading ability, will be reported to parents in July.

Year 2 - Schools have been asked to do an internal assessment of Year 2 phonics in the Autumn Term as these children missed their Year 1 phonics screening check last year. In May, children take part in Key Stage 1 tests for Reading, Maths and Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar. These results, along with the teachers' assessment of their work throughout the year, will be shared with parents in July.

Year 4 - In June, the children will take part in the new Multiplication Screening Check. This is a new assessment for children in Year 4. It is a short online assessment of their times tables up to and including 12 x 12.

Year 6 - In May, Year 6 will have their end of Key Stage 2 SATS. These include a range of tests for Grammar, Spelling, Reading and Maths. These results will be reported to parents, alongside your child's end of year report in July. Writing is judged by on the child's work throughout the year.

In January we will provide more information for parents who have a child in Year 2 and 6 about SATs.

The online application system is now open at <u>www.eadmissions.org.uk</u>. All parents must apply online; paper forms are not available. A step-by-step guidance on how to submit an online application is included in the attachments to this newsletter. If you need help, call the School Admissions Customer Services Team on 020 8359 7651 for support and guidance.

Parents of children in Year 6 who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) should already have received a letter from the SEN Team setting out the secondary phase transfer process for children with EHCPs. These children will be allocated a school place in February 2022. If you parents of children with an EHCP have not received a letter or require further information, they should contact SENadmin@barnet.gov.uk

Applications received after the 31 October 2021 deadline will be considered after all on-time applications have been processed and parents will not receive an outcome email on National Offer Day.
