In **Year 1** they have been developing their understanding of time by making their own life timelines and sequencing some of the main events of their lives' so far.


In Year 2 they have been continuing their learning about the environment by writing persuasive speeches about plastic, pollution and the ocean.



Whilst I understand that holidays are important for lots of families, this does not mean that they are 'exceptional'. Under the Education (Penalty Notices) (England) Regulations 2007, as amended, the Local Education Authority has the power to issue Fixed-penalty Notices of £60, (rising to £120 if not paid within 21 days), where parents fail to ensure school attendance or take children on holiday without authorisation from the head teacher.
