Covid Update: New guidance was published following on from the Prime Minister's announcement on Saturday. School staff are encouraged to wear masks in communal areas in school and where social distancing is not possible. We will be monitoring the situation closely in the coming weeks.


FOMS Christmas Raffle - Friday 10th December The draw will take place on Friday 10th December so please make sure that your tickets are in by Wednesday 8th December
