It was fantastic to see the enthusiasm and positivity of the children as they returned to school last week. In Reception we welcomed the children for visits and this week they will stay for mornings and lunchtimes. Year 1 have made a great start to the year. They have been using the book, The Colour Monster, as a way to think about managing their feelings and emotions during the transition from Reception to Year 1.









Year 2 are doing a topic called

Scrumdiddlyumptious this half term. They will be learning about all things food related! They had a great time making their fruit kebabs on Wednesday. They have also been writing instructions and learning about a healthy diet.

In Year 3 they have begun their Predator topic, learning about animals eat.. Their whole class reader this term is Krindlekrax





Year 4's topic is called Potions and they will be using Alice in Wonderland as their class text. They have also been revisiting Zones of Regulation at the start of the term.

Year 5's topic this half term is called Beast Creator. They were exploring and classifying invertebrates as part of their science lesson this week. Their class text this half term is Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo.







Year 6 are learning about the Industrial Revolution and the Victorian Age as part of their work this half term. They are using the novel Streetchild by Berlie Doherty as the basis for some of their English work. The photo shows them getting into character, writing descriptions of Mrs Hodder from the novel!


