
Year 1 were finding out about the Solar System and the order of the planets last week. They were also learning about how to find 1 more than a number as you can see from the photo!

Year 2 were using The Incredible Book Eating Boy by Oliver Jeffers for their English work last week. The children acted out the story, then sequenced the events and began writing a recount.

Year 3 were learning about the different ways fossils are formed by looking at different examples. They also worked in groups to think about what they know about their skeletons; hopefully this knowledge will improve over the next few weeks!

Pupil Council

Children from Year 2 to 6 have had the opportunity to stand as their class representative for pupil council. It has been lovely to see how seriously the children have been taking their campaigning, including making speeches to their classmates. Not all the year groups have finished their elections just yet, but by the end of this week, we will find out who has been democratically elected. The first meeting of Pupil Council is in two weeks time.







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Year 4 were investigating states of matter this week as part of their science lessons.

The children in Year 4 also began their ukulele lessons. This is part of the Barnet Wider Opportunities music project. For the next two terms they will be having lessons with one of the BEAT music teachers to learn how to play an instrument. This is part-funded by FOMS - thank you!

Just a reminder to Year 4 parents that when you are collecting your child at the end of the day, please come to the bottom playground to do so. This is so helpful in ensuring that the children are dismissed safely.

Year 5's have been writing their bug hotel adverts this week. They have been learning about metamorphosis and using classification keys in science.

Year 6 have been learning about the structure of Victorian society and the differing experiences of those in different classes. They have also been learning about the life of William Morris and the impact he had, and continues to have, on design.

Times Tables



The National Curriculum expects that most children will know all the multiplication and division facts by the end of Year 4. There will be a new statutory check to measure this. All children practise their times tables in maths lessons from Year 1 and this is supplemented by short weekly tests. These tests are just one in a number of ways that we work on this objective. We also value all the effort that so many parents put in to helping with remembering these all important facts.

There is a lot of debate about whether children need to 'know' their times tables and whether quick recall is really necessary. Our aim as a school is to make sure that children are **confident** and have committed their times tables to their long term memory. By doing this, they can spend less time and effort on working out the calculation and more on using their times table knowledge to solve more complex problems.

It is also important to remember that whilst some children can learn times tables very quickly, it can take other children a little bit longer. There is no pressure from teachers about 'passing the test', but a focus on trying your best and doing a bit better each week.

The weekly tests in **Key Stage 2** are 5 minutes and will now focus on both multiplication and division facts e.g. $6 \times 2 = 12$, $2 \times 6 = 12$, $12 \div 2 = 6$, $12 \div 6 = 2$.

At the start of the year, children will be asked to warm-up by having a go at a test they have previously passed. If they have already earnt all their badges, they will do other activities related to times tables to practice applying their knowledge.


Times tables tests will be introduced to Key Stage 1 later in the year when this part of the curriculum is covered. There will be more in the newsletter in the Spring Term about this. By the end of Year 2 children need to know the multiplication and division facts for at least the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Tests	Times tables to practise	Badge
1-30	2, 3, 5, 10	Blue Star
4 – 60	2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 10	Silver Star
7 – 9	2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10	Gold Star
