Parent Coffee Morning

Supporting attention at home... Do you worry about your child's attention and listening? Would you like some ideas about how to get your child to focus or concentrate?

At our Coffee morning on Wednesday 25th January 2023, Tiffany Nelson, Trainee Educational Psychologist, will be talking about supporting your child's attention at home. She will briefly cover some theory and factors that influence attention. She will look at strategies to support your child's attention and there will be an opportunity for discussion and to carry out some activities.

In Reception the children were continuing their learning about Little Red Riding Hood. The children have been retelling the story in a variety of ways as you can see from the photos! Weather depending, this week the children will be going out for a walk to look at different houses. Thank you to the parents who have sent in photos of the children's homes which will also be used as part of their work this week. If you have not had the chance, you can still email it to the Office.

In Year 1 the children have been learning about health and hygiene as part of their PSHE lessons. This week they were thinking about how to clean their teeth effectively. This links really well to the learning that they will do in Year 4 about the digestive system.









Year 2 were writing about hospitals last week. They were also learning about and taking digital photographs as part of the Computing curriculum.

If you have a child in Year 3, I am sure that they have been telling you all about their PSHE lesson this week, where they learnt how much sugar is in various foods. They investigated the packaging of every day foods and compared that to how much sugar they need for a health diet. In Year 4 the children have been carrying out an investigation into the effect of different liquids on teeth (although they are using eggs instead).

In Year 5 the children have also been carrying out scientific enquiry into the heliocentric model of the universe (the Earth and planets rotating around the sun) and how that view has changed over time. In Year 6 the children have been planning their narratives based on the short film, Alma as well as learning about the circulatory system. There will be information coming this week about the Isle of Wight trip in May.





Ms Dunning and I have been meeting with teachers to discuss the children's progress. It is lovely to hear how well so many of the children are doing, how hard they are trying and about the progress they are making.

Just a reminder that if your child has a Numbots, TTRs or Wordshark log in but you have had problems logging in, please let us know so we can help resolve the issue. Children who are using these sites regularly are making great progress and we would not want anyone to miss out!

Storysharers

One of the areas that we are developing this year is the children's opportunities for taking responsibility. Last week the children in Year 5 and 6 who applied for the role of 'Storysharers' began their jobs. It was lovely to see how enthusiastic they were when they arrived at school (many of whom came earlier than usual to be able to help) and the how proud they were to help children in Year 1 and 2 read.

Online Safety Day

We are coming up to Online Safety Day (Tuesday 7th February). As part of the work that we are doing in school to ensure that children understand and can use the internet safely, we are also offering a session to parents. This will be a virtual pre recorded session that parents will be able to access between Monday 30th January and Sunday 5th February. It is a 1 hour long and parents will be sent the link closer to the time.

I am hoping that by giving plenty of advance notice, you will be able to find an hour in that week to be able to log on and take part.

The training is run by Education Child Protection who are specialists in Safeguarding. I have attended some of their training recently and it was really informative and uptodate.
