




Spring Term 223 Newsletter 10

#### Governor Visit Day

On Friday, our governors took time off work or out of their busy lives to spend in school. They spent time in classrooms, visiting lessons and talking to the staff and children. Here are some of their reflections on the day:

I thoroughly enjoyed my visit to Monkfrith on Friday. I sat in on lessons, ate lunch with the children and looked through the children's books. Throughout the day, the children talked to me about what they were learning, what they liked and disliked about lessons, who their friends were and so many other things. What is definitely noticeable about our children is how willing they are to show off their school and how articulate they are. No-one held back telling me exactly what they thought! Similarly, the teaching staff were welcoming in all classes and keen to talk about teaching techniques and whatever else was on their minds.

All around the school, are wonderful displays of children's work and things to inspire them. What makes them even better is knowing that they are driven by the children themselves – Ms Deasey said that she is simply the administrator who gets told what to put up and where to put it! I was very impressed by the Pupil Council display where members have written their biographies and what they hope to achieve.

I'll finish with my favourite response of the day. When I asked a year 6 girl to tell me about something that she had learned in Maths in her previous years that helped her now, she replied "The column method. I would DIE without the column method!" Having had the privilege and pleasure to observe and speak with pupils and staff on Friday, I can honestly say that our children are learning in a positive, safe, and engaging environment.
