We had a great start back to term last week. I hope those of you who were celebrating the end of Ramadan had a lovely weekend.

Reception

For the next few weeks, Reception will be learning about all things minibeast-related. They will be finding out about caterpillars, butterflies, worms, smails and more...

As part of their aim of enriching the experiences we are able to offer in school, FOMS are funding ZooLab to visit the children this Wednesday.

In Phonics they will be consolidating lots of their learning from phase 3 before moving on to phase 4.

In Maths the children will be looking at numbers and counting beyond 10 followed by adding and taking away.

Year 1

The topic in Year 1 this half term is called **'Paws, Claws and Whiskers'**. The children will learn about different animals and link that to science and geography. They will be visiting Willows Farm and reading The Tiger Who Came To Tea!

In Maths they will be learning about volume and capacity, then starting to look at multiplication and division related to 2s and 10ss and then move on to finding fractions of shapes.

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Year 2

The topic in Year 2 this half term is called **'Rainforests'**. The children will be learning about the different layers of the rainforest and animal habitats. In art they will be developing their sketching techniques. Last week the children read the Kapok Tree as a basis for some descriptive writing and later in the term the children will be reading the Just So Stories before writing their own version.



In Maths the children will be looking at multiplication and division related to 2s, 5s and 10s and then do some work on fractions.

Year 3

The topic in Year 3 this half term is called 'Rocks, Relics and Rumbles'. The children will be learning about the what causes volcanoes and the different types of rocks. Last week they began by finding out about the layers that make up the Earth.

In addition to this they will also be visiting the Natural History Museum next month. Their whole class reading novel is The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane by Kate Di Camillo.

In Maths the children will be doing some more work on fractions then move onto using money and learning about time.

Year 4

The topic in Year 4 this half term is called 'Playlist'. The children will be learning about sound, how it is made, how we hear it and how sounds make us feel. Last week they were also starting to write a short narrative using their senses based on a music video.

In reading, the children will be finishing Alien in the Jam Factory before moving on to 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' by Joe Todd Stanton.

In Maths the children will be doing some more work on decimals, before moving on to money and time.

Year 5

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In Year 5 their 'Alchemy Island' topic is rich with science and geography. They will be learning about grid references and compass points as well as properties of solids, liquids and gases. They will also be designing their own code to create computer games. Last week (and this week) the children were writing cinquain poems.

In reading, their text is based on the Greek myth of Odysseus.

In Maths the children will be doing some more work on decimals, before moving on to money and time.

Year 6 have started the term with some revision in preparation for their SATs in two weeks time.

However they have also been doing some fantastic artwork based on their topic for this half term - Gallery Rebels. Over the next few weeks, they will be learning about different artistic movements. Last week they looked at pointillism and this week they will explore the work of the surrealists. In Science, they will learn about the science of colour and chromatography.

After SATs we (and I am including me in that!) head to the Isle of Wight for their Year 6 residential. We have not been for the past three years because of Covid and so I am delighted that the children will get to go! A letter will be going out on Tuesday with the final arrangements and the kit list. Keep your fingers crossed for some sun!
