In Year 1 last week the children were learning about classification of animals as well as preparing questions for their trip to Willows Farm today!

In Year 2, they were continuing to learn about the animals and what they need to survive. They were also beginning to plan their piece of writing based on the layers of the rainforest

Year 3 were learning about volcanoes and how they erupt. The children were also finishing (and then publishing) their

In Year 4 the children were learning about sound and how it is made. They were also finding out about different ways that sound can be recorded.

In Year 5, as part of their Alchemy Island project, the children were investigating the difference between reversible and irreversible changes. They were also doing some drama activities based on their class reader this half term, Odysseus.

In Year 6 the children were learning about the surrealist art work of Dali before creating their own using pastels. The quality of the work, and the effort of the children, is fantastic!

## KS2 Sports Day

We have had to make a change to the date for the KS2 Sports Day as we have just been informed that one of the secondary schools is holding it's transition day for Year 6 pupils on the day we had planned. We have changed it provisionally to the Monday of that week but are still waiting to hear back from the other secondary schools about their plans. We will confirm a date as soon as possible.

## Changes to prices of school meals

Our catering is provided by a company called ISS who hold a contract with Barnet Council. At the end of last week, we were notified that there will be an increase in the price of school meals from June. The reason for this change is the increase in food inflation, the increase in the London Living Wage of 8.1%, the increasing cost of fuel and transport.

From 6th June the cost of a school meal will change from £2.34 to £2.55.

If your child is in Reception or Key Stage 1, the meal will continue to be provided free of charge by the Government.

If your family is entitled to Free School Meals and you have a child in Key Stage 2, there will be no charge.

You may have seen that from September, the Mayor of London has announced plans to provide all primary school children with free school meals for one year. We have not had further details about this at present, but these will be shared when we do.

## Idle Engines

Idling is when a vehicle's engine is left running while parked or stationery and contributes to toxic emissions. Idling causes high levels of air pollution and high levels of air pollution disproportionately impact children's health.

The World Health Organisation believe that reducing car emissions could prevent over 2 million deaths each year by 2030.

It can also lead to a fixed penalty notice under The Road Traffic Regulations 2002.

Please think about this when you are waiting at the start and end of the school day.


