Year 3 have been using The Iron Man by Ted Hughes in their topic, Mighty Metals. On Wednesday, they went to the hall and used the clues from the text to work out how big the Iron Man is! The children have also been exploring the sugar content of food in PSHE this week by looking at different types of packaging.

Year 4 learnt about roads during Roman times. They were also practising hard in their recorder lessons. Parents are invited to see what they have been doing on 6th December

In Year 5 the children continued their learning about why the River Nile supported the Ancient Egyptians and started to find out about hieroglyphs. On Wednesday, 5LD did the first class assembly of the year. It was lovely to see how much the children had learnt over the first half term and that so many families were able to come along and watch. In Year 6 the children were continuing to write their non chronological reports about icebergs. They were also treated to a first hand recount of Mrs Powell's recent trip to see the Northern Lights!

This is a team event where children compete in indoor field and track events to gain points for their school. The selected children spent their lunch times practising and they worked as a team to compete against 8 Barnet schools on the day. We are so proud of our athletes that represented us.

The atmosphere was wild and they encouraged each other throughout. They were the best behaved school at the event and their ability blew all that watched away. The hard work, training and the teamwork paid off as we came 2^{nd} and received silver medals. The children really loved seeing you there cheering them along. Thank you also to all the staff who helped prepare the children through their trial, training and at the event.


