In **Reception** last week, the children were reading the book, This is Our House by Michael Rosen. They looked at the structure of the story and used this to create their own story maps.

Year 1 has a special visitor on Monday for their Victorian workshop. They had to line up in rows just like the children would have done in a Victorian school and learnt about the types of lessons that they would have had. Mrs Kotwani and Ms Czuprynska were so impressed with the children's interest and level of participation.

On Friday afternoon we welcome nearly 270 children from Ashmole,, Danegrove and Osidge to take part in the Barnet Infant Music Festival. This event is run by the Barnet Educational Arts Trust.

For the last few weeks the children in Year 2 have been learning a range of songs on the theme of friendship, in addition to this they had to learn a scarf dance and a song to perform to everyone else.

Mrs Choudhury and Mr Powell, along with the help of Mr Filby have been working really hard to prepare the children. It was such a lovely afternoon - as you would expect our children listened well, gave their all to the performance and were beautifully behaved throughout! Year 2 will be taking the lead in KS1 Show next term so there is lots to look forward to!



Year 2 were looking at the features of a letter this week. They then used what they had learnt to write to Aunt Lucy in role as Paddington.

Year 3 were also writing in character as they took on the role of Hogarth seeing the Iron Man for the first time. The children also made parachutes and investigated magnetic forces. 3DW began preparations for their class assembly which is in two weeks (Wednesday 29th November at 9am).

As you can see, Year 4 became Boudicca last week! In art, they developed their portraiture skills using sketching pencils.

Year 5 are visiting the British Museum today to look at the Egyptian galleries. Last week, they looked at how the Egyptian timeline fits into the history they have studied so far. They also began their Design and Technology project in which they will be designing a throne for Pharaoh.



Lateness

Good punctuality is important for lots of reasons. Arriving after the gates close at 8.55am, should not be a regular occurrence. In most classes, as the register is being taken, the learning is already starting. Children might be reviewing their teacher's marking from the previous lesson or revisiting the learning ready for the lesson they are about to have. Lessons start straight afterwards, so if your child arrives after this, they are missing out on what is being taught.

Being frequently late for school adds up to lost learning:

- Arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to over 3 days lost each year.
- Arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year.
- Arriving 30 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 19 days a year.

Registers close at 9.15am, and so if your child arrives after this time, they will be marked as an unauthorised absence without a satisfactory reason.



In Year 6 the children have been using historical sources to find out passengers on the Titanic as well as the failed trip of Scott to Antarctica.

Well done to **6K** who treated us to a fabulous class assembly last Wednesday about their learning from last half term. This week **6S** will be taking centre stage!

Last week was also Anti Bullying Week. The children took part in Odd Sock Day on Monday and then did lots of PSHE lessons about kindness, friendship, bullying and speaking out when you see something happening to someone else.


Attendance and Punctuality
