## Spring Term 2024 Newsletter 1

Welcome back to 2024! On behalf of all the staff, I would like to say a huge thank you for the gifts and cards we received at the end of term.

This half term is short (just 5 weeks!) but full of exciting learning, trips and experiences. In addition to the learning as part of our planned curriculum, we will also be celebrating Online Safety Day and Children's Mental Health Week in February.

In Reception the children will be focusing on traditional tales and making links with other areas of the curriculum. This week they have been looking at the story of Little Red Riding Hood.

In Year 1 the children's topic is called Splendid Skies. They will learn about seasons and the weather in the UK and in other parts of the world.

In Year 2 the children will be learning about the impact of particular people on our world in their topic - Big Dreamers and Changemakers. The children will be finding out about Amelia Earhart, Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Frida Kahlo. As you can see, this week they asked questions to Amelia Earhart.

In Year 3 the children will be learning about Greece and the myths and legends of the Ancient Greeks. The children will be reading Rumaysa by Radiya Hafiza.

In Year 4 the children will be learning about the body in their topic, Burps, Bottoms and Bile. They will learn about teeth and their digestive system. They will also be visiting the British Library to take part in the Sacred Texts workshop. Year 4 will also be reading Griffin Gate by Vashti Hardy.

Some children in Year 4 had their Bikeability sessions on Thursday and Friday. Children in Year 6 who signed up for a place will have their sessions at the end of the month.

The topic in Year 5 is called Alchemy Island. The focus is on science and the different properties of materials and the periodic table. They will also be reading Tom's Midnight Garden by Philippa Pearce.

In Year 6 the children will be learning about the circulatory system in their topic Bloodheart. They will also be visiting the Royal Institute - the home of Science - to learn about DNA. This half term the children will also be reading Skellig by David Almond.

Idling

As the weather has turned colder, it has been noticeable how many parents who drive are parked outside school with their engines running. Leaving engines running while stationary for more than a minute is known as idling and is a source of air pollution. It is also a offence for which a Fixed Penalty Notice can be issued.

Pollution caused by idling vehicles disproportionately affects children. Young people have greater exposure to harmful pollutants as, on average, they take twice as many breaths as adults.

Please do not park outside school and leave your engine running.

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Due to the success of the Dr Bikes in December in Barnet's car parks, particularly among parents/carers and children, there has been demand to continue these into the new year.

The free Dr Bike sessions will be run by qualified bicycle mechanics. Members of the public can take along their bicycles to have a free, full safety check, which includes the condition of tyres, rims, gears, brake function and tyre pressure and adjustments can be made if required, all for free.




## Attendance and Punctuality
