

Monkfrith School Spring Term 2024 Newsletter 2 In **Reception** the children have been acting out the story of Little Red Riding Hood. Next week they will going on a local walk to look at different homes in the area.



In Year 1 the children have been looking at the weather in the UK and writing own weather diary. In their Computing lessons, they have been using shape, link and colour to recreate the work of different artists.



In Year 2 the children have been writing a diary entry from the perspective of Amelia Earhart. They have also been combining their PSHE and Maths lessons as they learn about spending money and how to calculate change!

Today Year 1 and Year 2 have been visited by the Road Safety roadshow. They were taught about the important of walking to school and how to do this safely.

In Year 5 the children have been learning the geographical skills of compass points and reading coordinates and 6 figure grid references. In Science they have also started to investigate the properties of different materials.

In Year 3 they have been learning about light and how to use mirrors to create their own periscopes. The children have also been learning about different Greek gods as well as the feature of Ancient Greek pottery.

In Year 4 have been writing non chronological reports about teeth. They were also visited by a dentist who answered the children's questions about teeth and dentistry.

4M also had a great time at the British Library learning about Sacred Religious Texts. Thank you to the parents who helped.

In Year 6 have been using the short film, Alma, to inspire their own story writing. They were also lucky enough to be the first to use the brand new dictionaries and thesaurus' that we have purchased with the support of FOMS. In their Computing lessons they were looking at the features of websites ready to design their own.

Also, well done to the Year 6 girls who played against Brunswick Park on Tuesday. After a fiercely contested first half and many near misses Monkfrith went into halftime 1-0 after a powerful long shot from Erin that nestled into the bottom corner. The girls battled on in the second half but Brunswick got 1 back. The game ended 1-1. Miss Shah and Mr Powell are so pleased with how well they are playing as a team.

School Meals

Alongside this week's newsletter, you will be receiving a letter from the Mayor's Office. As you will know, all primary school aged children have had the option of a free school meal since September. This was initially offered a one year pilot. It has now been funded for a further year and so in the 2024/5 academic year, children will continue to have the option of a free school meal. Due to the success of the Dr Bikes in December in Barnet's car parks, particularly among parents/carers and children, there has been demand to continue these into the new year.

The free Dr Bike sessions will be run by qualified bicycle mechanics. Members of the public can take along their bicycles to have a free, full safety check, which includes the condition of tyres, rims, gears, brake function and tyre pressure and adjustments can be made if required, all for free.


Requesting Exceptional Term Time Leave
