The children in Reception went out on their first school trip this week! They went out in small groups to look our local area Some children were very excited to be able to see their own house on the way! The children have been using what they saw to create their own maps.









In Year 1 have been writing and performing their own weather forecasts this week using what their observational weather diaries from last week. The children have also been using wax crayons to create their own art work inspired by the weather.









In Year 2 the children have been finding out about hospitals now and in the past. They have been learning about how Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale changed nursing.

In Year 3 the children have been experimenting with paint mixing techniques. They have then painted their Greek-inspired pottery.

After their dentist visit last week, Year 4 have been writing their information leaflets about teeth which they are going to share with Year 1. 4P have also been practicing for their class assembly next Wednesday.

In Year 5 the children have been investigating magnetism and thermal insulation as part of their Alchemy Island topic.

In Year 6 the children visited The Royal Institute this week to take part in a workshop about DNA. The children get the opportunity to be real scientists in a laboratory setting and use a range of scientific apparatus to extract their own DNA. They have also been doing some fantastic writing taking inspiration from the short film, Alma.




Attendance and Punctuality
