This week, Year 6 have been sitting their SATs. To help have a positive start to the day, the children came in a little bit earlier for some breakfast and to play.

In Year 2 the children have been learning about how to mix different shades and tones by adding white or black. They have been exploring how to use different brushes with control to make different lines. The work the children have produced so far is fantastic!







After School Club


After School Club is full or nearly full most days now. Ms Costas does a great job of being as flexible as possible, but we are getting an increasing number of very last minute changes to bookings. Year 5 have been investigating Newton's Laws of Motion in their Science lessons. They have also been reading more of their book, the Boy in the Tower by Polly Ho Yen. In art this afternoon the children were revisiting their pencil drawing skills as they prepare for their portraiture unit after half term.



In **Reception** the children have been exploring the habits of snails as they continue their work on minibeasts. The children have been creating fact posters and diagrams of a minibeast sandwich.

In Year 3 the children have been writing their reports about rivers. They have also been using maps and atlases to look at rivers and settlements. Their whole class reading text this term is The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane by Kate DiCamillo.

In Year 4 they have been learning about different musicians like Evelyn Glennie and Louis Armstrong. The children have also been learning about the functions of the parts of the ear and how sound travels through different states of matter. Parents with children in Year 4 should have received the next letter about Phasels Wood today, which includes information about the medical forms and the all important kit list.

Just a reminder that children in Year 4 will also be taking the multiplication screening check in June. This is a computerised assessment that all children in Year 4 across the country take to check in on how well they know their times tables. By the end of Year 4 it is expected that children should have fairly quick recall of all their times tables up to and including 12x12. We teach this as part of our maths curriculum, but I know lots of children also practice at home to help build their confidence.


