Sports Days

We are at the point in the year where events come thick and fast.

KS2 - Thursday 27th June

This Thursday afternoon is the Key Stage 2 sports afternoon. Children in KS2 should come dressed in their PE kit and trainers to save changing on the day. We will be aiming to start at approximately 1.30pm. You will find us in Oakhill Park (we are intending to set up near the Cafe but it does depend a bit on the weather beforehand). \we aim to finish at approximately 3pm and will take the children back to school to be dismissed. Please do not ask to take your child directly from the park as this makes it much more challenging for class teachers to ensure that we know where all the children are! Please make sure that if you do not need your After School Club place that day that you cancel in advance.

In addition to all their sports week activities, the children in Reception have been practising for their Sports Morning next week and doing their end of year phonics assessments.

Year 3 have been testing soups as part of their Design and Technology lessons.

Year 5 have been learning about Anne Boleyn and putting their persuasive skills to the test as they plead to Henry VIII to spare their life! They have also been finishing their portraits of Henry VIII. The children tried really hard to think about proportion scaling and shading.

Year 6 have been learning about colonisation and slavery. They have also started practising for their Year 6 leavers show next month. They are reading Freedom 1783 by Catherine Johnson which explores a boy's experience of slavery in Britain.



Next week will also see the first round of the KS1 and KS2 Spelling Bee. This was a real highlight last year. The children do spelling tests in their classes before the top 4 from the year group going through to the finals. Match funding


