In school this week, the children have been very busy. **Year 3** went to visit the Barnet Environmental Centre as part of their topic. They learnt all about germination and pollination. Luckily, the weather was good and that meant they were able to explore the nature researve and the wildlife that they are taking care of there. Thank you so much to all the parents who came along to help out - these trips are only possible with your support.

In **Reception**, their topic at the moment is 'All About Me!'. The children have been using mirrors to look at their own faces and drawing self-portraits. They have been reading **The Colour Monster** and **Welcome to the World** and talking about the family photos that have been sent in (thank you!). As is always the case in Reception, the children have been outside playing with our new water play equipment. The new resources that we purchased (with the help of FOMS) have meant that more children can be involved in being creative, curious and collaborative.



### **Reception Curriculum Meeting - Reminder**

Reception parents are invited to a Curriculum Evening on Tuesday, 7th October 2025 at 7pm. We'll share how we teach early reading, phonics, and maths at Monkfrith, and give tips on supporting learning at home. The session will last about an hour, followed by drinks and nibbles from FOMS. This event is for adults only, but information will be sent home if you're unable to attend.



**Year 5** have been looking at the drawings done by Charles Darwin with a focus on minibeasts. They have been combining these detailed drawings with zentangles (focusing on the artist Rosalind Monk).

The children head out on their trip to Kingswood on Wednesday and will be back on Friday afternoon (all being well by the usual pick-up time). Please make sure that you have checked the kit list so that they have everything they need for the trip.

**Year 1** have been reading the **Tiger Who Came To Tea** by Judith Kerr this week. They have been roleplaying the story and sequencing the events. In Art, they have been using graphite pencils and charocal to draw their own tigers!



**Year 6** have been learning about the artist William Morris and his influence on the Arts and Crafts movement during the Victorian era. They will be heading to Christ Church in Southgate at the start of next week to look at the original William Morris stained glass designs in the church.

**Year 2** have been learning about the journey of a banana from plantation to supermarket. In their PSHE lessons, they have been finding out where some different foods come from around the world and the importance of buying ethically and fairly. **Year 4** have been making and testing predictions about melting and cooling in their science lessons. They are also making their jam tart design ready for next week!
