On Wednesday morning, 6P performed their class assembly. The children chose the work they wanted to share and wrote their own script. At the end, they gave us an African drumming masterclass. Also in Year 6 this week, the children have been finishing *Street Child* and writing their book reviews. They have also been writing some lovely poems that are based on themselves, inspired by the poets they have looked at as part of Black History Month. In Year 1, they have been finishing off their Paws, Claws, and Whiskers topic by looking at animals in a zoo and practicing their addition skills.

Year 5 Swimmming

On Friday last week, Year 4 experimented with making their own potions using their knowledge of solids, liquids, and gases. This week they have been baking their jam tarts and learning about the life and work of Madam C.J. Walker (as part of Black History Month).



Year 2 has been learning about Floella Benjamin and the Windrush as part of Black History Month. You may have also heard them singing "Dancing Queen," which is the song that they are preparing for the Barnet Music Festival! I have been singing along in my office!





In Year 5, they have been using chicken wire and a variety of other materials to begin crafting their minibeasts.

How you can help your child get ready for their Autumn Term...

Reception	The children will be learning about Autumn and the seasons, night and day and nocturnal and diurnal animals.	Thank you to those of you who have already sent in some photos of your child and Autumn, if you have not, then there is still time. You could go to the library to borrow books like: Storm by Sam Usher or Ava and the Acorn by Lu Fraser, The Darkest Dark by Chris Hadfield, The Lights that Dance in the Night by Yuval Zommer.
Year 1 Moon Zoom	The children will be learning about the space, the planets and Neil Armstrong. They will also learn ways that they can look after our planet in PSHE.	You could visit the Planeterium or the Science Museum. The imax cinema has an immersive tour of the International Space station. You could go to the library to borrow books like: Man on the Moon by Slmon, Little People, BIG DREAMS Katherine Johnson, Planetarium by Raman Prinja.
Year 2 Street Detectives	The children will learn about our local geoography, the differences between London and Peru and reading Paddington.	As you are out and about over the holidays, look at maps and talk about the local area. Books you might be interested in: L is for London by Paul thurlby or A City Through Time by Matilda Gollon.
Year 3 Mighty Metals	The children will be learning about electricity, forces and magnetism. Class Text: Iron Man by Ted Hughes	Books you might be interested in: Where does lightning come from by Anna Claybourne, A Life in Electric by Azadeh Westergaard, Jabari Tries by Gaia Cornwall or Boom Science: Forces.
Year 4 I am Warrior	This topic introduces the Romans the life of Boudicca. Class Text: Griffin Gate by Vashti Hardy	You could visit the Roman galleries at the British Museum. Books you might be interested in: Meet the Ancient Romans by James Davies or the Roman Soldier's Handbook.
Year 5 Phaorohs	The children will be learning all about life in Ancient Egypt. Class Text: Odyessus	You could visit the Egyptian Galleries at the British Museum. Books you might be interested in: Egyptian Myths by Jean Menzies, Myths, Mummies and Magic in Ancient Eygpt by Nuria Tamarit or The Story of Tutankhamun by Isabel Greenberg.
Year 6 The Frozen Kingdom	The children will find out about the Arctic and Antarctic, the journey of Robert Falcon Scott, the Titanic and all about animal adaptation. Class Text: Holes by Louis Sachar	You could visit the Legend of the Titanic exhibtion in London or go the Imax screening of Antarctica at the Science Museum. Books you might be interested in: Rescuring Titanic by Flora Delargy, Ice Trap! by MP Robertson or Race to the Frozen North by Catherine Johnson.



Barnet Libraries have lots of events over the holidaus. Children can learn how to DJ and explore Afrobeats sounds at Superstar DJs. For Green Libraries Week, take part in Seeds of Change, an eco-craft activity with seed planting. There's a Sing, Story and Sign session for children to learn some simple British Sign Language and a solar system coding and robotics workshop. There are craft events to celebrate Halloween and a spooky drama workshop based on the book 'Room on the Broom'. Like a Choose Your Own Adventure book, 'Lose the Path, Find Your Way' is an interactive show with enchanting movement, music and puppetry. Booking is required for some events.
